Dr. Bret M. Ribotsky enters the PM Podiatry Hall of Fame

t is my profound privilege, pleasure, and honor to introduce Bret Ribotsky, DPM as the recipient of the 2016 Podiatry Management Lifetime Achievement Award and announce his induction into the Podiatry Management Hall of Fame.

Bret has been a close friend of mine for the past 25 years and I have had the opportunity to collaborate with him as a student, resident, surgeon, teacher, lecturer, APMA leader, father of two successful children, entrepreneur, boater, skier, scuba diver; and have greatly enjoyed canceling office hours on a Friday afternoon to meet him at a local theater whenever a new James Bond or Sci-Fi movie is released.

Bret Ribotsky's personality is larger than life. He is one of a handful of podiatrists in the country who is instantly recognized by the majority of

other podiatrists. His contributions to the profession are innovative, impactful, and have touched the lives of thousands of podiatrists, and he has single-handily improved our profession.

Dr. Ribotsky was born and raised in Miami Beach where he developed an early fascination with photography, boating, and medicine. He attended The University of South Florida in Tampa where he graduated with a degree in biology and then attended Temple University College

of Podiatric Medicine where he was elected president of his class. Bret completed two separate residencies: one year in Podiatric Orthopedics in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and two additional years in Advanced Foot and Ankle Surgery in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Bret is a fellow of the American College of Foot & Ankle Orthopedics & Medicine. From 1999 to 2001, Dr. Ribotsky served as two-term President of the American College of Foot and Ankle Orthopedics & Medicine. He has been honored multiple times during his career in podiatric medicine, including a Bronze Stickel Award in 1996 for Research in Podiatric Medicine from the *Journal of the APMA* and was inducted into the National Academy of Practice as a Distinguished Practitioner. *Podiatry Management Magazine* has chosen Dr. Ribotsky as one of the top VIP DPMs in every listing over the years.

Dr. Ribotsky has worked as a consultant alongside General Alexander Haig on Health Journal TV where he was seen by 10 million people and has been a national and international speaker and researcher, along with serving on the editorial boards of several medical publications. Prior to entering private practice in Boca Raton, Dr. Ribotsky was the first podiatrist to be employed at the Cleveland Clinic Florida and was a member

of the Department of Orthopedics where he treated many celebrities and famous athletes.

One of Bret's greatest talents and where he has the most passion is public speaking. He has conducted over 750 lectures over the past 20 years and has lectured at every major podiatry conference in the world. Dr. Ribotsky has also created several medical seminars including: "Step Ahead"—a multi-disciplinary approach to the foot and ankle, "Putting it into Practice"—a practice management seminar series, "Be Certified's Boot Camp for your Mind"—a board certification preparatory course, and "Remember the Knee"—the first educational course specializing in knee disorders for podiatrists.

In 2009, Dr. Ribotsky created an innovative educational program for podiatrists called "Meet the Masters", where he has interviewed over 250 physicians and influential leaders in the field of podiatric medicine, surgery, and practice management. This extremely valuable archival collection of advice for new and established practitioners highlighting the best in podiatric medicine with an audience over three thousand physicians each week is also available for free on his www.PodiatricSuccess.com website.


