Dr. Wenstrup will be further feted during the *Podiatry Management* Hall of Fame ceremony as this year's DPM inductee. He will be joined by non-DPM inductee Daniel Vickers. The event will have a new format this year as a reception during the evening on July 12. You may purchase your tickets to the recep-
