ly in health care costs (Nussbaum, et al., 2018), though exact costs are difficult to measure secondary to the variety of treatment settings and failure of patients to easily access the health care system for treatment (Nussbaum, et al., 2018).

Podiatrists have an opportunity and natural advantage in seeing patients with wound care needs and thus are in a prime position to provide treatment for ulcers and wounds at an earlier stage before they can progress to chronic stages. With prompt intervention, acute wounds have a better chance of healing; reducing pain, threat of infection, and impaired mobility for patients; and helping to lower overall health care costs.

In addition to providing a solution for the rising costs of health care, podiatrists who treat wounds in-office are in a unique position to provide greater value for patients.
